



Radisson Community Updates

The Public Hearing for the B & F Development project at Drakes Landing has been scheduled by the Town of Lysander Planning Board for Thursday, February 10th at 7:15pm. The Public Hearing will be held at the Lysander Town Building at 8220 Loop Road. Per an agreement with the Town of Lysander, the RCA will be resurfacing some of the recently installed green/white street signs so they reflect a brown and white color scheme. Residents may notice street signs are missing for a few hours when the new signs are being installed. Additional details will be in the 2/11 Reflections.

The RCA has been informed by New York Power Authority (NYPA) that they will be conducting work which will involve the removal of trees located in their right-of-way, near or in close proximity to, the transmission lines. They expect this work to begin next week and to take a few weeks to complete. Lewis Tree Service will be conducting the tree removals.

It has been brought to our attention that trash cans are being placed in the road on trash day. We understand that with the snow it might be a bit harder to keep the trash cans in the yard or driveways but we do need to keep the roads completely clear for the safety of our residents and the plow trucks that are trying to remove the snow in the roadways.

In addition, our office has received calls about vehicles being parked in the streets. This creates a number of hazardous situations, especially on cul de sac circles: emergency vehicles cannot pass, snow plows cannot clear the snow, and neighbors risk damaging vehicles when entering and exiting their own driveways.

Please be safe and courteous and do not park on the road whenever possible. If you do need to do so temporarily, please do so on one side of the street and be mindful of your neighbor's access to their driveway. Overnight parking is prohibited in the Town of Lysander November – April.

Seasonal Reminders

Holiday Decoration Reminder

Holiday decorations must be removed 30 days after the holiday. If that is not possible due to weather conditions, lights can remain in place until April 1, provided that they are not in use.

Fire Hydrant Notice

There are approximately 300+ fire hydrants located within the Radisson Community. Keeping them cleared of snow

decreases the amount of time that it takes for the hydrants to be accessed in an emergency. If there is a fire hydrant located on your property, for the safety of your family and neighbors, please keep it free of snow. Clear about 3 feet around the hydrant and from hydrant to the street to give firefighters enough room to work.

Trash & Recycling Tote Storage

As per the Architectural Standards Guidelines, trash and recycling totes may not be stored outside. Totes may be placed outside the evening before your scheduled pick-up day and must be moved indoors the same day that your trash is picked up.

Please remember to position totes with at least enough space between them (3-4') for the automated lift arm of the truck to maneuver properly.
