Holiday Recycling Tips

Occra.org has lots of tips for holiday recycling. Many packaging and wrapping items can be placed in your recycling tote, though some should be thrown away. With recycling markets so depressed, it's more important than ever to **ONLY** recycle appropriate items.

Recycle These Items:

- Cardboard packing/delivery boxes.
- Gift boxes and gift bags without glitter or metallic decoration.
- Any non-metallic/non-foil wrapping paper, greeting cards and envelopes.
- Glossy items are ok to recycle.
- *Clean* aluminum foil and disposable aluminum baking trays.

Trash These Items:

- Tissue Paper
- Any box, bag, envelope or wrap with and metallic/foil decorations or liners.
- Styrofoam
- Ribbons and bows

Keep in mind that donating usable items is another way to recycle! Clothing, linens, shoes, toys and books can be used by another person or family.
